The Big questions...

Science: Changing Materials:

1.What do we know? Want to find out? Can prove? What can a material be? How do we know a material has dissolved? What is a solution? What do we call materials that won't dissolve? Know that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution,

Plan different types of scientific enquiries to answer questions, including recognising and controlling variables where necessary.

2. Why do we repeat tests?

Take careful measurements, decide when to repeat tests, draw conclusion from collected data, identifying causal links.

3.Can we get back materials we have dissolved? Could the Mayans re use their dissolved cacao? What is an irreversible change? What happens when we cook or burn materials?

Describe how dissolved materials can be recovered form solutions

Demonstrate that some changes result in the formation of new materials which are irreversible changes.

4.Can we recover all mixed materials?

Use knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to decide how to separate mixtures .Know that dissolving, mixing and changes of state are reversible changes.
